- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Rural Health Training
- 5 Opportunities Act".

1	SEC. 2. GEOGRAPHICAL DIVERSITY IN PROVISION OF
2	GRANTS; INCLUSION OF TRANSPORTATION
3	ASSISTANCE PLAN AMONG SUPPORT SERV-
4	ICES.
5	Section 2008 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
6	1397g) is amended by redesignating subsections (c) and
7	(d) as subsections (d) and (e), respectively, and by insert-
8	ing after subsection (b) the following:
9	"(c) Geographical Diversity; Transportation
10	Assistance Plan.—
11	"(1) Preference for applications for
12	PROJECTS TO SERVE A RURAL AREA.—In consid-
13	ering applications for a grant under this section, the
14	Secretary shall give preference to applications which
15	describe a demonstration project that will serve a
16	rural area in which—
17	"(A) the community in which the individ-
18	uals to be enrolled in the project reside is lo-
19	cated;
20	"(B) the project will be conducted; or
21	"(C) an employer partnership that has
22	committed to hiring individuals who successfully
23	complete all activities under the project is lo-
24	cated.
25	"(2) Support required to include trans-
26	PORTATION ASSISTANCE PLAN.—A project for which

1	a grant is made under this section shall include a
2	plan to provide project participants with transpor-
3	tation through means such as the following:
4	"(A) Referral to, and assistance with en-
5	rollment in, a subsidized transportation pro-
6	gram.
7	"(B) If a subsidized transportation pro-
8	gram is not reasonably available, direct pay-
9	ments to subsidize transportation costs.
10	For purposes of this paragraph, the term 'transpor-
11	tation' includes public transit, or gasoline for a per-
12	sonal vehicle if public transit is not reasonably ac-
13	cessible or available.
14	"(3) Reports to the congress.—During
15	each Congress, the Secretary shall submit to the
16	Committee on Ways and Means of the House of
17	Representatives and the Committee on Finance of
18	the Senate a report—
19	"(A) on, with respect to the period since
20	the period covered in the most recent prior re-
21	port submitted under this paragraph—
22	"(i) the number of applications sub-
23	mitted under each subsection of this sec-
24	tion, with a separate statement of the
