H.R. 3150 – A Plan To Prevent Social Security Cuts for Millions of Americans

If Congress does not act soon, 11 million Americans will see their earned Social Security benefits cut by **19 percent** in 2016. This is despite the fact that Social Security currently has <u>\$2.8 trillion in trust fund reserves</u>, which those Americans helped build up through their hard work and contributions to Social Security. The average American facing a cut in 2016 worked and paid into Social Security for <u>22</u> <u>years</u>.

Congress can act without delay to ensure that all Americans receive the Social Security they earned. The **One Social Security Act** would prevent these cuts and ensure that all Americans receive the Social Security benefits they've earned.

- Ensures that Americans get the Social Security benefits they've earned
- Does not add a penny to the deficit or the debt
- Does not change Social Security's overall financial condition
- Pays all Social Security benefits using trust fund reserves that current Social Security beneficiaries helped build up through their own contributions
