Re: Request for Information Related to the Climate Crisis and Health Industry

To Whom It May Concern,

The impact of the climate crisis on health is well documented – from increasing rates of asthma in vulnerable communities, to an increase in deaths from extreme weather events, heat, infectious and vector-borne diseases, and compromised food supplies. Yet, less attention has been paid to the fact that the health care industry as a whole is responsible for an estimated 10 percent of greenhouse gas emissions in the United States (U.S.) and more than four percent of worldwide greenhouse gas emissions. In particular, a vast amount of emissions, 71 percent, are primarily derived from the health care supply chain through the production, transport, and disposal of goods and services. If the global health sector were a country, it would be the fifthlargest emitter on the planet. With U.S. greenhouse gas emissions rising by an estimated six percent between 2010 and 2018, it is clear that all actors in the health care system have roles to play in addressing their contributions to the climate crisis.
