 that such statement has been submitted prior to the vote
 on passage.

7 (b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION FOR CONGRESSIONAL
8 ENFORCEMENT.—This Act, with the exception of section
9 4, is designated as an emergency for purposes of pay-as10 you-go principles. In the Senate, this Act is designated
11 as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 403(a)
12 of S. Con. Res. 13 (111th Congress), the concurrent reso13 lution on the budget for fiscal year 2010.

(c) EMERGENCY DESIGNATION FOR STATUTORY
PAYGO.—This Act, with the exception of section 4, is
designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010
(Public Law 111–139; 2 U.S.C. 933(g)).
